Dear Friends,

For almost two years, our lives have been impacted by the Covid pandemic. When it first hit in late 2019, Loaves & Fishes was worried about how they would meet the needs of the most vulnerable in our community. The Scouts of Mecklenburg County responded in the winter of 2020 with one of our most successful Scouting for Food drives ever. We collected more than 278,000 lbs. of food and filled the Loaves & Fishes warehouse. As the pandemic continued into the year, the need for Loaves & Fishes services continued to grow. As we prepared for the 2021 Scouting for Food drive we were forced to “alter” our proven model. The paper bags were replaced with door hangers, an online giving option was created, the Scouts at the Door went away, and the food being collected at sites was going to the warehouse to be sorted. We held our breath and hoped the new plan would work. And did it ever! Residents of Mecklenburg County donated food and cash that equated to 346,000 lbs. of food, making the 2021 Scouting for Food drive our most successful to date!

We are taking the lessons learned in 2021 and are replicating them again in 2022. We will once again utilize door hangers and an online giving option. This year, we are ordering an extra 100,000 door hangers so we don't run out. In addition, all of our collection sites will remain the same and sorting will be done at the Loaves & Fishes warehouse. And now, Loaves & Fishes has merged with Friendship Trays into one organization to feed more people as Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays.

Saturday, February 5, 2022, is “Scouting for Food” collection day in Mecklenburg County Council. Sunday, February 6, 2022, is “Scout Sunday”. This special weekend in February is again our opportunity to deliver the promise of the Scouting program. We can again inspire youth and adult leaders, in and out of Scouting, to high levels of service and volunteerism. We can affirm that the BSA is the nation's leading organization in providing community service, and we can heighten our community's awareness of BSA's service commitment.

Scouting for Food is the official “*Good Turn for America*” for the Mecklenburg County Council. As an organization, the Boy Scouts are dedicated to giving back to our communities. Scouting for Food teaches youth the value of helping others.

We want to “Thank you” in advance for your participation in Scouting for Food, and we ask for your patience in the event Covid restrictions cause us to make last minute changes to the program. We will do our best to keep you up to date.

## Mecklenburg County Council – Boy Scouts of America Scouting for Food

### **Background**

Studies indicate that more than 50 million Americans, including 17 million children go hungry at some time every month; these studies also reveal that there are more hungry people in America now than in any time in the last twenty-five years.

Hunger is a problem we can do something about by working together. Scouting for Food is a starting point. It is an example of our long-standing commitment to community service. Throughout this project the BSA directly helps meet the needs of the hungry, while exposing its members, particularly its youth, to the highest ideals of the Scouting movement through a practical and dramatic experience in the principle of the Good Turn.

BSA's role is to organize the food collection. Locally, the food collected during the "Scouting for Food" campaign is warehoused and distributed, by Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays through their network of food pantries, to our neighbors in need.

### **History**

Thanks to the hard work of many scouts, scouters, and scouting families, the generosity of our friends and neighbors, these are the food totals from recent years:

### **2022 Goal**

Our goal is to collect enough food for Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays to serve all residents who need their assistance, plus to have every Troop, Pack, Venturing Crew, and Explorer Post in Mecklenburg County Council actively participate in Scouting for Food.

## **Journey to Excellence/ Good Turn for America hours.**

Scouting for Food is an annual Boy Scouts of America nationwide effort. Locally it is the Mecklenburg County Council/Catawba Lodge's council-wide service project. The food drive is a great opportunity for scouts of all ages to serve our community and for units to earn Journey to Excellence/ Good Turn for America hours.

## **Loaves & Fishes is now Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays**

All the food collected will be distributed by Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays through its network of food pantries located throughout Mecklenburg County. Loaves & Fishes provides a week's worth of nutritious groceries and home delivered meals to families and individuals in need. ## **Cash and Online Contributions**

Although the contribution of food is preferred, cash contributions are also accepted and will be used to buy needed food. Each dollar equates to 4 lbs. of food. Checks can be written to "BSA-Scouting for Food" and turned in to the Scouting for Food collection site coordinator. Online "text" donations are also encouraged at text Scout4Food to 44321.

## **Assigned Areas**

Each unit is asked to sign up for an assigned area/neighborhood. Units with overlapping neighborhoods are asked to decide/agree ahead of time which neighborhoods they will cover. If you have any questions about your assigned area, please contact your District Scouting for Food Coordinator.

## **Service to Others**

Scouting for Food is rooted in the very foundation of the Scouting movement. Through initiative and hard work, the Boy Scouts have developed a framework that helps thousands of our neighbors in need. The Scouting for Food Campaign will continue to bring Scout units closer to their neighborhoods, Chartered Organizations, and community by focusing on this stewardship project aimed at addressing the problems of hunger in the communities in which we live and work.





## Mecklenburg County Council – Boy Scouts of America Scouting for Food Important Dates

1. **December 2021 Roundtables** – Due to Covid and the limited in-person meetings, units are asked to take the same collection area(s) as 2021. District SFF coordinators have last year’s maps with assigned areas.
2. **Before January 2022 Roundtable** - Estimate the number of “door hangers” your unit will need for your collection area.
3. **January Roundtable** - Pick up the SFF “door hangers” your unit will need. We will have reps at all Roundtable meeting locations with “door hangers”. They are much smaller and less onerous to transport than bags. Additional “door hangers” will be available at the Scout office, Huntersville UMC, and the Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays office.
4. **Early January- Announcements** – Ask your charter organization to place announcements in their January newsletters and/or bulletins. Ask your clergy to include Scouting for Food in their pulpit announcements.
5. **Week of January 29<sup>th</sup>** - Neighborhood “door hanger” distribution - Please distribute “door hangers” to your assigned neighborhoods (five to seven days before the Scouting for Food Pick up day).
6. **Saturday, February 5<sup>th</sup> – Scouting for Food 2022** – All units collect food from your assigned neighborhoods and deliver to one of the Scouting for Food (SFF) collection sites.
7. *If your unit is participating in church collections (in addition to your unit(s) neighborhood collections) here are other important dates:*

**Sunday, January 30<sup>th</sup>** - Ask members of your congregation to bring food the following week.

**February 6<sup>th</sup> (Scout Sunday)** - Gather the “congregational food donations” and take to a designated SFF Sunday collection site.

### Quick Guide

**Who:** Scouts, leaders, and parents of Mecklenburg County Council Packs, Troops, Venture Crews, and Explorer Posts, and members of Catawba Lodge Order of the Arrow.

**What:** Scouting for Food is the largest single-day food collection event in Mecklenburg County. It is the number one council-wide "Good Turn for America" service project. On one day thousands of Scouts go door to door collecting non-perishable food items for our neighbors in need.

In 2021, Mecklenburg County Council Packs, Troops and Venture Crews, in cooperation with Catawba Lodge Order of the Arrow, collected and sorted approx. 346,000 lbs. of food.

**When:** Beginning January 29, 2022, Mecklenburg County Council units will distribute SFF "door hangers" asking our neighbors to participate.

On Saturday, February 5<sup>th</sup> units will go door-to-door to collect bags and boxes filled with non-perishable food.

Due to Covid concerns, we will not be able to have units participating in the "Scouts at the Door" program at Harris Teeter stores.

On Sunday February 6<sup>th</sup> units may collect donated food at local churches if they are meeting in person.

**Where:** Throughout all of Mecklenburg County area.

**Why:** Since BSA's inception in 1910, members have learned to live the principles of the Scout Oath and Law through community services and helping other people at all times. With that in mind, this is an ideal time to help Loaves & Fishes stock food pantries shelves.

All the food collected will be distributed through one of Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays' food pantries located in Mecklenburg County where it goes directly to individuals and families in need.

### Unit Leader Check List

- ✓ Speak with your District SFF Coordinator and confirm your collection area.
- ✓ Determine how many scouts will participate and how many adults will be available to drive when distributing “door hangers”.
- ✓ Determine how many homes are within your assigned collection area.
- ✓ Determine number of “door hangers” needed and share with your District Coordinator. The number should be the similar to 2021.
- ✓ Create additional marketing tools as needed.
- ✓ Distribute “door hangers” and delivery instructions to scouts before event.
- ✓ Assemble all scouts and adults to receive final instructions before distributing “door hangers” and collecting food.
- ✓ All scouts wear “Class A” uniforms when distributing “door hangers” and collecting food.
- ✓ Scouts stay in buddy teams. Please note, no scout should be alone, and none are to ride in the back of pickup trucks.
- ✓ Begin distribution and collection after 9:00am, not earlier.
- ✓ Hang the “door hangers” on front door or place it on the front porch - do not knock, (but if the resident is outside or greets you, explain the program). Please do not cut across yards – use sidewalks or driveways – **DO NOT PUT “DOOR HANGERS” ON MAILBOXES (NEWSPAPER TUBES ARE O.K.)**
- ✓ On collection day, only collect visible bags - do not knock or ask for bags.
- ✓ **IMPORTANT** - have a 'Clean Up' team re-visit your assigned area at least one time in the early afternoon in order to gather “missed or late” bags.
- ✓ New units, please speak with your District SFF Coordinator for available neighborhoods.

#### 1. Flyers:

- Preprinted flyers for Scouting for Food are available electronically.
- On the Scout Sunday flyers, be sure to add your Church name and Pack and/or Troop number in the spaces marked as (XX).
- To create your own flyers:  
It is always very effective when troops and packs create their own personalized flyers. Be sure that **Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays** is listed as the recipient, and it is helpful to remind people not to include glass items.

**NOTE:** It is our suggestion that the Scouts do not put their full names on the flyers. Names are not really required, but if you use names, we suggest only the first initial and last name (for youth safety). Do not list the Scouts home address on the flyer – only generic information such as their Troop or Pack number or where their unit meets. We want to maintain “Safe Scouting”.

Remember - Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays has a suggested priority needs list. The items include canned fruit (especially no sugar added), canned meats, canned pastas, cereal and low or no sodium canned vegetables.

To report information about your unit's Scouting for Food service project, you will need your unit ID (five to 11 digits) and your unit number (four digits, no letters – for example, Troop 24 should read 0024). You can get this information by calling your council service center (704) 333 5471.

Click on "Enter service hours here." Choose "Click here to log in or create an account." ### **First-Time Users**

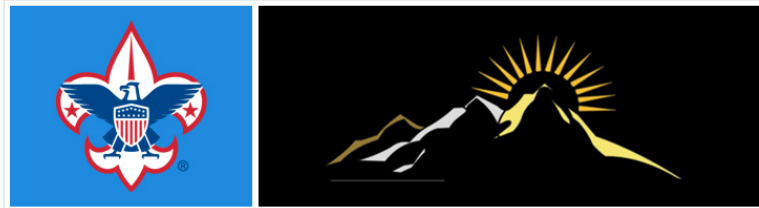

## Getting the Word Out – We Need Your Help!

Social Media is one of the best ways to get the word out that Scouting for Food is coming to your neighborhood.

So many neighborhoods have a dedicated **neighborhood Facebook page** as well as **Next Door** pages, making it easy to alert neighbors that Scouts will be coming to drop off door hangers with information about Scouting for Food and then reminding them to put their bags out for pick up by 9am Scouting for Food Saturday.

If you are collecting in your neighborhood, please take a minute to post on your own neighborhood pages and ask the parents in in your units to do the same for their neighborhoods. Adding a photo of the door hanger, scouts from your unit putting them out, or a full bag out on the porch ready for pick up would all be a great way to catch neighbors' attention.

*Then feel free to add something along the lines of:*

It's time for Scouting for Food! Be on the lookout for a door hanger with information about Scouting for Food to arrive on your doorstep this week. Scouts from Troop xx will begin dropping them off in the neighborhood starting Monday. Simply fill a bag or box with nonperishable food items such as canned fruit (especially no sugar added), canned meats, canned pastas, cereal and low or no sodium canned vegetables and leave out for pick up by 9 am Saturday, February 5. All food donated will go to feed hungry neighbors in need through Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays!

For a bag pick up reminder post:

Don't forget to leave a bag or box filled with nonperishable food items on your doorstep by 9am this Saturday for Scouting for Food. Help feed hungry neighbors in need @loavesfishesnc @meckbsa. Thank you!!

And please tag Loaves & Fishes @loavesfishesnc and Mecklenburg County Council, Boy Scouts of America @MeckBSA in your posts.
