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Course Overview

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills

This is a fun-filled program of hands-on skills training in the outdoors, designed to help Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to master and teach the basic camping skills required for Tenderfoot to First Class. This Course is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to receive the Trained Patch. Instructors will help you learn how to set up camp, cook, work with woods tools, learn about ropes, planning campfire programs, map reading and compass skills, hiking, and packing techniques, nature identification, and Leave No Trace.

Subjects to Be Covered

The subjects to be covered in the course include (but are not limited to):

- The Patrol Method
- The EDGE Method
- Campfire Planning and Program
- Tents and Campsite Selection
- Packing and Hiking Techniques
- Wood Tools
- Knots and Lashings
- Campsite Sanitation
- Outdoor Ethics
- Fire Building
- Orienteering

The cost for the course is \$45.00 plus a \$1 registration fee and includes all food for the course.

Checking In

Check-in begins at 6:45 am on Nov 13, 2021 at the OLS Check-In area just past the Dining Hall and lasts until 7:30 am.

You must arrive with a completed BSA Health Form – Parts A and B – and a signed COVID-19 Mitigation Risk Waiver document.

Once you are checked in, proceed to the gear drop-off area near the Boy Scout parade field. Drop off all personal gear in the designated area and return your vehicle to the parking area near the check-in area. Once parked, return to the Catawba Shelter to meet up with your patrol and Troop Guides.

Recommended Equipment

This checklist covers the minimum equipment you will need to bring to camp. If you do not personally own any of the items listed, you may want to contact other troop or pack leaders or friends to borrow them for the weekend. While we want you to be comfortable, we want to ensure you make the most of this training without shouldering too many expenses.

The Course Quartermaster will provide all the food, including cracker barrels, but if you want to bring your own snacks, please feel free to do so.

Important: Please remember that the weather this time of year can be highly variable and can change quickly. Keep an eye on the weather forecast for the days leading up to the course. Please make sure that you bring plenty of warm layers, and wet weather protection. You will be camping, and most of the course will be held outdoors, rain or shine!

Overnight gear, outdoor essentials and appropriate clothing are the heart of camping equipment. Bring a *light load of only what you need* to keep yourself safe and make a good camp for 1 night; leave all unnecessary items at home. For example, no personal cooking gear will be required.

Uniform

The preferred uniform for the event is the Class "A" Uniform. If you have not obtained a Class "A" uniform, it's OK – we'd rather have you than the uniform.



Tent

Bring a lightweight backpacking tent (with footprint or ground cloth) for two only – no wall or large recreation types (space is limited in the area where you will be camping). Each participant should bring their own tent. **NOTE:** *Hammocks are acceptable if that is your preference.*

Camp Chair

Bring a camp chair to utilize throughout the weekend. Due to Covid-19 precautions, we will be utilizing camp chairs when gathered in a large group rather than picnic tables in order to maintain social distancing.

Via Albemarle Road

From I-485, take exit 41, NC 24/27 Albemarle Rd east toward Albemarle. Go 1.6 miles and turn right on Cabarrus Road. Go 2.7 miles and turn right on Ferguson Road. Go 0.8 miles and turn left on McManus Road. Go 1.2 miles and turn right on Belt Road. Go 0.6 miles to the camp entrance on the left.

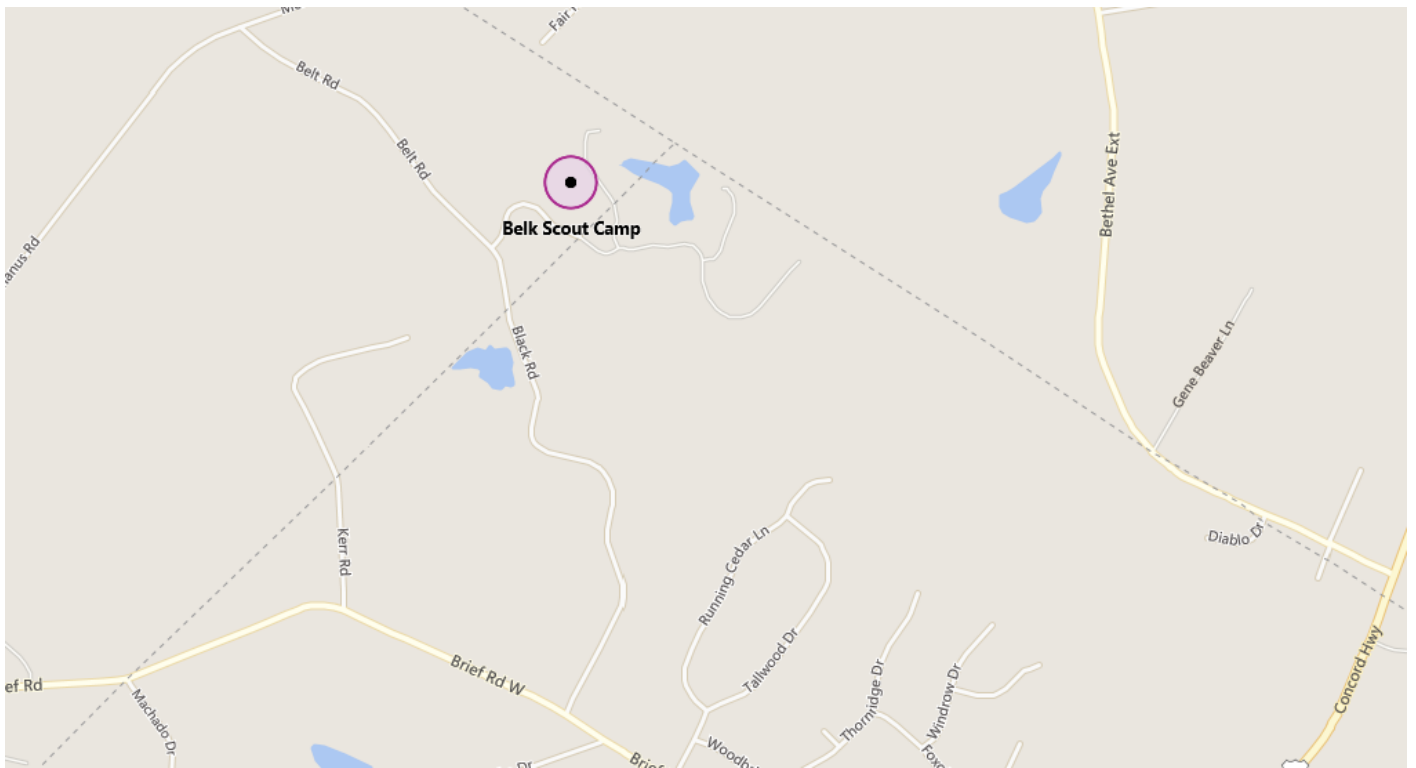
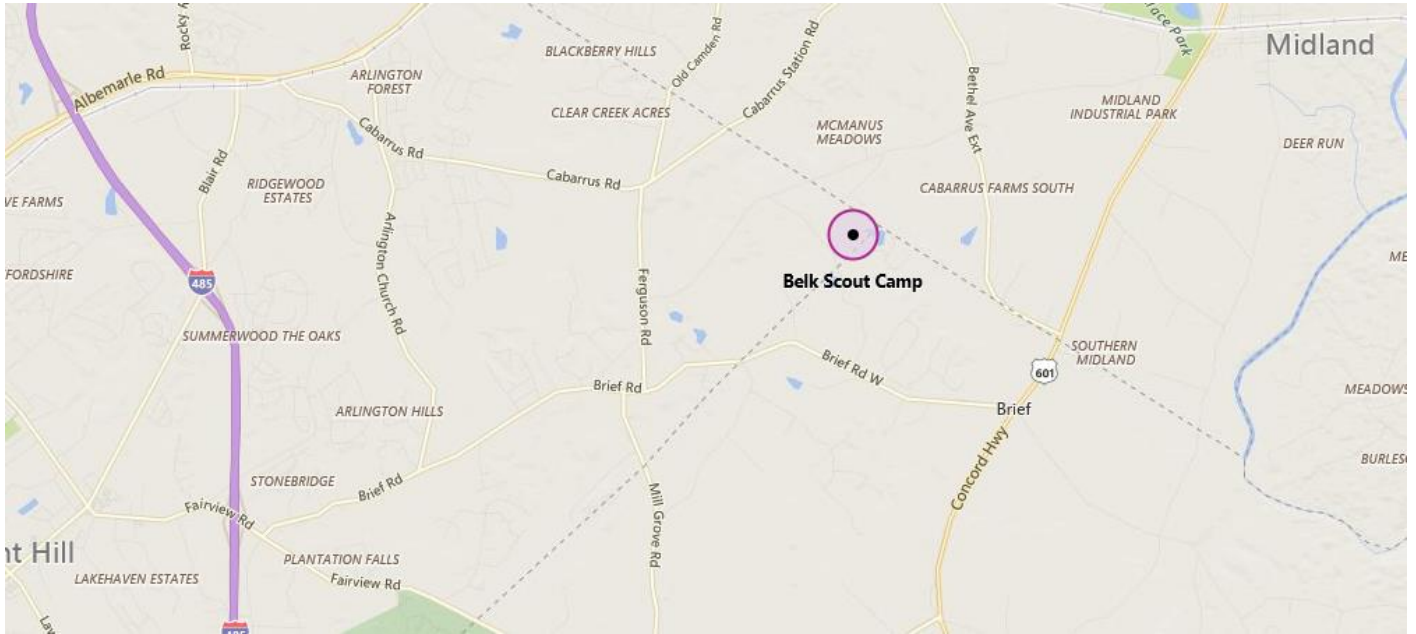
Via Brief Road

From I-485, take exit 44, NC 218 east toward Fairview. Just past the 485 interchange, turn left on Brief Road. Go 4.5 miles and turn left on Black Road. Go 0.9 miles to the camp entrance on the right.
